



This 400 m2 office combines rustic and modern elements to create a clear brand identity for a Global Agricultural Company. The client wanted the space to feel warm and "down to earth", but at the same time represent their image as an innovative and forwardthinking company. The design uses planks of Raulí wood harvested directly from their farm in the South of Chile to clad walls in the reception area, brainstorming room, and kitchen.

The layout considered how to maximize the number of workstations for the growing company, while allowing a flexibility in the types of spaces available for the staff to work individually, in teams, and in meeting rooms. Cozy cabins were constructed in the reception area providing a place for small meetings and focused work to happen away from the open workstation area. A lounge provides a light filled open space with soft seating for working or meeting in a more relaxed setting.



The brainstorming room to the right, combines rustic and high-tech elements. A warm wood clad media wall contains a smart screen, video camera, and speakers, allowing the client to strategize with their teams located in different parts of the world. This room quickly became the heart of the office. It is the place where creative work takes place and where the staff can come together to have lunch at the farm style table.














INCORPORATING BIOPHILIC DESIGN INTO THE OFFICE

In the open office, a wall mural was inspired by the patchwork of farmlands seen from an aerial view. This mural brings the colors of planted fields from the farm to the urban office environment. Plants are incorporated throughout the office, and large patios adjacent to the workstations and offices provide a connection to the outdoors and ample natural light.




WALL MURAL LAYOUT








ARTWORK COORDINATION

A digital marketing and creative agency approached Emerge with the challenge of renovating their existing dark and segmented office on a modest budget. The goal of the project was to open up the office and transform it into a modern and luminous space inspiring creativity and teamwork.

Throughout the design process, there was close collaboration between the client and Emerge, resulting in an innovative design that responds to the unique identity and culture of the company. The space is organized as an open plan with break-out areas for design sessions and informal team meetings. As a company that originally started as the first Cyber Café in Chile, one of the initial design concepts was to bring back the café culture to the company. A vibrant café and lounge area with sliding chalk boards provide informal spaces where creative design teams can brainstorm.






The prominent design theme for this private office located on the lower level of a LEED Gold building, was to delineate zones and define boundaries without compromising the sensations of spaciousness and light. The result is a design that features white washed wood panels and a system of slats to create thresholds, filter views, and to frame zones of use while allowing natural light to penetrate throughout the office. The modern and simple palette of light pine and smooth black granite is consistent from the reception desk all the way through to the private offices and conference room to unify the spaces.










This law office was designed to be minimal and sophisticated, yet cozy and welcoming. The client wanted the space to feel like an extension of home and to maintain the character of a small and friendly style law firm.

An informal meeting area also serves as a place for the lawyers to have lunch together. Wood panels and slats on the wall and ceiling bring warmth, acoustical treatment, and definition to the open space.

The reception area features a desk fabricated from carrara marble and walnut wood. Natural light is brought into the reception area and common corridors through the use of glass walls at the conference rooms with sections of frosted film to provide privacy.













Designed as an upscale co-work rental office for established professional service firms, the client wanted the space to be minimal and elegant yet maintain a warm and inviting feeling. Glass dividing walls allow the views of the ocean to be seen throughout the office. Accents of wood slats and graphite grey lacquered millwork for the reception area, conference room and kitchen help to add warmth and drama.





The kitchen and lounge area is designed as an open coffee bar concept. Wood slats provide a separation from the corridor and fabric acoustical wall panels in the seating area help to reduce noise reverberation.










AXON OF RECEPTION DESK



Upon entering the reception area, the design for the corporate offices of a privately owned bank conveys the image of strength and sophistication. The wall behind the reception desk is clad in graphite grey stone tile. This same material continues cladding around the secure storage area to create a dramatic element within the whole office. Elements of warm wood are used for the reception desk and furniture for contrast.



CVPA (College of Visual and Performing Arts)

Location: New Bedford, Massachusetts Completed: 2001

Interior renovation for the College of Visual and Performing Arts at the University of Massachusetts. The highlight of the project included the design of innovative fixtures and furniture intended to activate the lobby and public gallery of the building. The blackened steel, wood, and resin sculptural objects create a presence in the storefront along the main street of the city and conveys the school's identity as an art school.

Interior Design services included the selection and specification of furniture, fixtures, and finishes for all of the galleries, classrooms, staff offices, Dean's office and administration areas throughout the seven story building.











PEABODY ESSEX MUSEUM Art and Nature Center

Project by Urban Instruments

Location: Salem, Massachusetts Completed: 2003

This renowned museum of contemporary and historic art and culture embarked upon a special project to intrigue visitors to further enhance their experience by introducing an innovative center for education and technology.

By working closely with the curators, we defined an inventive way of presenting the existing collections through interactive exhibits and designed the interiors to reveal a fresh identity. Within this defined 6,000 sq. ft. area of the museum, we designed the interiors, fixtures, and new media displays to intrigue visitors to extend their stay at the museum, to promote dialogue, and to encourage participation in programs. An inviting and user friendly media room and art studios were included in the design as part of a new scope of public outreach programs. The design was developed to further appeal to a challenging younger audience by scaling the exhibits to their size, using bold colors, and providing opportunities for kids to be playful in the way they interact with the exhibits.











Designed for a Texan couple who desired to have their home in California renovated to feel like a sophisticated New York style penthouse. These jet- setters wanted their home to be an elegant place to entertain guests and to reflect their style; eclectic, dramatic, and minimalist. The project included structural renovations to re-organize interior spaces and to add new cantilevered decks on the 2nd and 3rd levels of the home. A full scope of interior design services featured custom furniture, fixtures and installations. A few of the main features to the interiors included a custom minimalist fireplace built into a new stone clad wall, a luminous screen wall constructed from an embossed resin that glows as a sculptural light fixture at night and a three story slatted wood wall that connects multiple levels and absorbs the reflection of sounds from the open spaces. Working with a landscape designer, we also focused on creating several exterior living spaces cascading along a steep hillside and linked by a grand staircase.
